Any veteran (active duty or medically retired) wounded or disabled since 9/11 qualifies. Virtually no disability is disqualifying: all training equipment is adaptable to individual challenges. No prior media training necessary.

Any wounded Marine or Navy Corpsman should already possess the basic skill set required to work professionally as part of a crew: discipline, leadership, dependability, attention to detail, instantaneous obedience to orders, mission accomplishment.

The bottom line is this: IF you were a good Marine or Navy Corpsman and want to continue working by that same ethos in one of the nation's largest growing industries, **we are looking for you!**

This training program is aggressively structured and executed. Students must be passionate to learn and ready to go to work upon graduation. PEB's must be completed prior to the start of training and pain management levels must be at a level to complete full workdays generally unmedicated.

This Foundation is not looking for the next Steven Spielberg. We train the transitioning serviceman or woman who will work for Steven Spielberg. Your military intangibles are what separate you from civilians in the entertainment industry workforce.

Those thinking they will check their military values at the door need not apply.

** Student applicants may apply for tuition funding assistance through the Chapter 31 VocRehab program. Our program is in process of being recertified by the VA for the next Class, which commences 9/10/08.
