

Mr. Curtis Lineweaver

Mr. Curtis Lineweaver retired from the Marine Corps in 2014 after a 26 year career. He began service in 1989 as an (0231) Intelligence Specialist. In 1995 he commissioned and became a MAGTF Intelligence Officer. Mr. Lineweaver's assignments included First Radio Battalion, Naval Technical Training Center, 2nd Intelligence Battalion, Joint Forces Staff College, MCIOC, and Training and Education Command. Mr. Lineweaver served in a variety of roles including company commander, battalion assistant operations officer, battalion executive officer, signals intelligence instructor, information operations instructor, intelligence senior watch officer and information operations officer. Mr. Lineweaver participated in several campaigns including Operation SOUTHERN WATCH, Operation IRAQI FREEDOM, and Operation ENDURING FREEDOM.

Mr. Lineweaver currently serves as the Supervisory Intelligence Specialist for Regional Support Team Three within the Marine Corps Information Operations Center. He serves as the team lead for a cross functional group providing reach back support to Operational and Fleet Marine Forces including Intelligence analysis, Operations in the Information Environment, and Psychological Operations. In this role, he serves as a principal advisor to the Marine Corps Forces Europe and Africa OIE Cell on matters pertaining to operational influence planning, information environment assessments, and threat activities therein. Mr. Lineweaver manages a team of contractors, civilians, and Marines and integrates reserve personnel into daily support and production cycles. Mr. Lineweaver has provided intelligence-related products in support of real-world and exercise planning as well as tailored plans designed to generate influence in target regions of the world. Mr. Lineweaver has served the MCIOC as a GG-13 Supervisory Intelligence Specialist since 2015.

Mr. Lineweaver personal decoration includes the 2020 John J. Guenther Intelligence Civilian of the Year award.
