Providing the Marine Corps Association Foundation with copies of your bequest will help ensure your wishes are met. With respect to designating specific purposes or programs, the Foundation staff can review the language to make sure it can carry out your intentions.

3. Inspiring Others

Estate gifts are a crucial source of support for the Marine Corps Association Foundation. If you document your bequest, you can inspire others to follow in your footsteps.

4. No Obligations

Please understand that by documenting your bequest, you are in no way making your bequest binding or irrevocable. You still have the liberty to revise your estate plan if your circumstances or priorities change, although we do ask that you notify us as a courtesy if that happens.
