Hospital Corpsman Third Class (FMF) Jay N. Dinh, U.S. Navy

Hospital Corpsman Third Class Jay N. Dinh, has always had a desire to serve his country so he enlisted in the United States Navy on February 19, 2020 with the goal of caring for Marines and Sailors. He completed basic training at Recruit Training Command, Great Lakes, Illinois, and subsequently attended Hospital Corpsman "A" School in San Antonio, Texas, graduating in August 2020.

Following "A" School, he reported to Field Medical Training Battalion-West at Camp Pendleton, California, where he earned the Field Medical Service Technician Navy Enlisted Classification (L03A) in September 2022.

In January 2023, HM3 Dinh was assigned to the 3d Littoral Combat Team, 3d Marine Littoral Regiment, based in Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii. He currently serves as the Lead Corpsman for the S-2 Intelligence Section of the 3d Littoral Combat Team, where he is responsible for the health and medical readiness of over 70 Marines and Officers. During his tour, he has deployed in support of major exercises, including Balikatan 2025 in the Philippines and Service Level Training Exercise-Hawaii. He has also served as a Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC) instructor and Battalion Medical Records Supervisor.

HM3 Dinh is a qualified Enlisted Fleet Marine Force Warfare Specialist. He further distinguished himself by completing the rigorous seven-week Hospital Corpsman Trauma Training program in Raleigh, North Carolina, gaining extensive hands-on experience in a high-volume, level-one trauma center. His military education includes the completion of the Navy's Introductory, Basic, and Primary Professional Military Education courses. He is pursuing an Associate of Health Sciences degree from American Military University.

An active contributor to the local community, HM3 Dinh dedicates his off-duty hours to volunteering at the YMCA, where he mentors and supports various youth empowerment initiatives.
